Financial goal: For over 25 years, the Sacred Heart of Jesus Latin Mass group has had the goal of having our own F. S. S. P. priest, our own church and a full parish life. In order to reach this goal, the Diocese of Saskatoon wants to see our weekly collection reach a minimum of \$1,550 per week or \$80,000 per year. "Unplanned" film: The film "Unplanned" will be shown at a number of theatres in Canada as part of a limited Canadian release beginning on Friday, July 12th. "Unplanned" is the true story of Abby Johnson, who worked for eight years at Planned Parenthood in the United States. She walked away from her job after witnessing an ultrasound-guided abortion. She has become a pro-life advocate ever since. She has helped some 500 abortion workers quit the industry. The film is rated 14-plus (disturbing content).
